


- 1. Check the clubhouse calendar to see if the date you will be requesting is available.

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#### Architectural Review Committee (ARC) Notes

This new segment in the Powhatan Signal is intended to inform homeowners and to highlight recurring issues.

The Architectural Guidelines were created to assist Powhatan Secondary homeowners in adhering to the Covenants and Restrictions and serve as the primary guide of the Architectural Review Committee (ARC).

All homeowners are responsible for requesting and obtaining ARC approval for projects prior to the start of work. Projects should be completed within ninety (90) days of the approval. Please dond forget to check with Miss Utility (<u>http:// va811.com/</u>) if you (or your contractor) plan to do any digging. Weave seen a number of cut cables because they werend marked.

The Architectural Guidelines and Attachments were recently updated with an effective date of January 31<sup>st</sup> 2018. This update offers improved readability, clarification of mailbox post and light replacements, and addition of hardscape requirements. You may download a copy from the PCSA website - powhatansecondary.org/ index.php# Under the @ocuments+Tab, select Governance and you will find the Guidelines, Attachments (with examples of acceptable fences, mailbox posts and lights, and storage sheds), and the ARC Application form. The following items (discussed in more detail in the Architectural Guidelines) are provided this month to highlight spring and summer projects. All require ARC review and approval:

<u>Landscaping</u>: No pavement, plantings or other landscaping materials may damage or interfere with any easement for the installation or maintenance of utilities.

<u>Hardscaping:</u> Hardscape involves stonework including stone retaining walls, patios and walkways, grading and drainage including terracing, site grading, and storm water management.

<u>Fencing</u>: Allowable types of fencing and installation requirements are treated in detail in the Architectural Guidelines.

<u>Storage Buildings:</u> Separate, small structures for storage of such items as garden tools are discouraged, but will be allowed in selected instances where the ARC is satisfied that the structure can successfully blend into the environment. You will find useful planning information in the Guidelines.

<u>Childrenc</u> Play Structures: Playhouses, swing & slide sets, and similar recreational structures are to be located in the rear of the property, ideally behind the house so as to be screened from the street and have adjoining neighborsqapproval.

## **Computer Security is a Shared Responsibility**

Imagine, you went to bed early, had a great night s sleep, woke up and realized someone had walked into your house and went through your things while you were sleeping! All your precious things have been touched, tossed, broken and stolen. You feel angry and violated. For the next few days you will have to spend most of your time and energy on the phone contacting the police, bank and credit card companies.

The Internet has brought us so many benefits: email, electronic messaging, personal websites allowing us to stay connected, informed, and involved with family, the ability to pay bills and make purchases. Along with increases in technology comes increasing risk. Just as you use safeguards to keep criminals out of your home, you also need safeguards to secure your computer. Many scammers target older Americans because they are more vulnerable and less computer skilled.

Scammers use different methods to exploit:

-Email - computer repair -Telephone - prescription medication sites - Auctions

-websites for charitable donations - student account sites - dating sites - health care sites

Once you have allowed someone onto your computer (remotely) they can go onto it at any time, going through your personal files, pictures and emails.

Do not open attachments, click links, or respond to email messages from unknown senders or companies that ask for your personal information. Most organizations . banks, charities, universities, companies, etc. dond ask for your personal information over email. Beware of requests to update or confirm your personal information. Beware of a pop up box error on your phone or computer stating you should call the phone number listed. Before calling the number, look up the company that is listed, and call the phone number on THEIR website letting them know about the message that has come up.

Don't communicate or reveal any personal information to strangers- online or by phone. Personal informa-

tion includes your name, address, age, phone number, birthday, email address, social security number, and insurance policy numbers . even your doctoros name. Be wary of emails offering % bee+gifts, prizes, or vacations. These are tricks designed to get you to give up personal information. Personal information can be pieced together to steal identities, money, or credit.

Every Internet user, no matter how young or old, is our Nationcs first line of defense against people who want to do harm. If we all become more aware of who we talk to, what we say, and what we share online, we can all make a big difference.

Have you been contacted by phone where someone says they are calling from Microsoft, Apple, or about a computer virus you have without you contacting them first? Did you accept their services and pay them via check or credit card? This is happening every day and has happened within your own newsletter community. This needs to **STOP**.
