Several weeks ago she was struck by a red sports car on Powhatan Secondary Road as it crosses the dam for Rennicks Pond. Thanks to the quick actions of Maria Buchite, Louise Pearson and several others, the swan was handed over to Kevin Rhind, the owner of Wildlife Services, Incorporated. He safely delivered it to the Godspeed Animal Hospital where the hospital staff nursed the swan back to health.

After the swan was released by the hospital, Mr. Rhind met with Maria Buchite, Louise Pearson, Susanne Esch and other residents of PCSA to release the swan back to her family. She was successfully reunited with her parents and was last seen resuming her patrols around the ponds with her parents.

Wildlife Services Incorporated donated its time at no charge and the staff at Godspeed Animal Hospital also donated their time was well. We are indebted to them for their help in this matter and we really appreciate their positive response. Both of these businesses are very involved with supporting community activities when it comes to animals and both appreciate the support of residents in the County. Godspeed has a non-profit organization called The St. Frances Fund that accepts donations to be used for purchasing



The PCSA Board of Directors met on November 16. CJ Jones advised that five RFPs had been sent out for bid to repair the stack block dam and he is awaiting responses. One contractor has declined to bid. Vegetation around the BMP's has been cleared. In addition, an RFP has been requested for an updated website which will also include the pool website. The audit for 2010 has been completed. The Board discussed and approved the 2011 Budget. The good news is that there will be no increase in the annual assessment for 2011. The Board has also been discussing capitol improvements for the coming year and the first improvements will be to the picnic area as well as a new and more substantial dock.

NEW PAYMENT OPTIONS

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

2010 has been a busy year for the Powhatan Secondary community. The Board of Directors has been working on a number of common area projects, many of which are required by the County or the State. One of the most important projects is upgrading the pond facilities (Best Management Practices – BMPs) by completing required maintenance. The County has started a three year program to inspect all BMP facilities in the County and advise owners of those facilities if they have minor or major maintenance issues that need to be addressed. To date, PCSA has seven of these facilities that require maintenance and attention. In addition, the Board is

working or making repairs to the stacked block dam in the BMP between the Colonies and the Berkeley sections of PCSA. Other projects that are under consideration for the upcoming year include improvements to the walking trail system that encompasses the community, and upgrading the picnic area next to Rennicks Pond.

Clubhouse Committee

The Clubhouse Committee is already in its fourth year. The purpose of the committee is to oversee the clubhouse use in order to maintain an acceptable level of upkeep. The committee members review the condition of the clubhouse before and after each rental use. The committee is composed of 7 homeowners. Each takes the review of the clubhouse a month at a time. Committee members are committed to keeping the clubhouse in good order and to report any needed usage repairs and the occasional misuse of the clubhouse by a user to Berkeley, our management company.

The Committee also makes recommendations to Berk-ley about enhancements to make clubhouse entertainment easier and more attractive for homeowners. This year the committee ordered four extra carriers for the portable chairs, purchased four new light weight tables, two smaller tables, and oversaw the installation of railings on the steps leading off the back porch. These railings were requested by residents. In January we contracted to have a massive cleaning of all the rugs and carpet, cleaned the grout and put sealer in the bathrooms, and had all the upholstered furniture steam cleaned.

We are indeed fortunate to have Jim Moody who does repairs and helps with keeping the facility running, from refrigerator to furnace repairs. He so often drops everything and comes to help out in an emergency. All of this is in order to maintain the clubhouse as a beautiful facility and a true asset to our community.

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St. Francis Wildlife and Compassion Fund Based at Godspeed Animal Care, 102 Tewning 253-0656

Who are we?

The **St. Francis Wildlife and Compassion Fund** was founded as a non-profit organization in 2007 to help meet the needs of the wildlife and pets of the needy in our community. It operates out of Godspeed Animal Care, a vet clinic in Williamsburg, VA, encompasses several counties and works with multiple volunteer wildlife rehabilitators. Funds are primarily raised by donation and the sale of "Memory Walk" Brick pavers which line the front walks of both Godspeed Animal Care and its neighbor, the St. Francis Pet Resort and Rehabilitation Center.

Wildlife

Each day, community residents bring in orphaned or injured animals such as possums, turtles, songbirds, foxes, raccoons, raptors, waterfowl, owls and even mice. There is no such thing as "important" or "unimportant" animals. Each is treated with the same respect, be it a swan or a turkey vulture. There are no charges billed for veterinary examinations or services rendered, hospitalization, nursing care, or in some cases euthanasia. The fund covers the costs of medications, appliances and food.

Compassionate Care

There are those in our community, who have fallen down on their luck, or simply cannot afford to care for their pets, especially in crisis situations. We recognize that for many people, their pets are all they have as a primary companion. It is our goal to make pet care affordable for these owners so that pets don't have to needlessly suffer or be euthanized. The St. Francis Wildlife and Compassion Fund provides funds, when available, for part or all of the care for these pets.

How Can You Partner With Us?

Donations are always welcome in monetary forms as well as equipment. The contributions made by those dropping animals off are helpful but almost never cover the cost of care.
